

Pam Tebow: Choosing Life Through Faith & Courage



When Pam Tebow learned she was pregnant while serving as a missionary in the Philippines, she was facing serious health complications. Doctors were concerned for her well-being and urged her to end the pregnancy. Faced with an uncertain future, Pam and her husband chose to continue the pregnancy, leaning on their faith and their belief in the value of every life.

Their son, Tim Tebow, was born on August 14, 1987. He would later become known for his accomplishments in football, but his influence has extended far beyond the field. Through the Tim Tebow Foundation, he has dedicated much of his life to serving others, including children with special needs, individuals affected by human trafficking, and vulnerable children and families.

Pam could not have known what the future would hold for her son when she made that difficult decision. Her story is a reminder that courage doesn't always mean knowing what comes next. Sometimes it means moving forward in faith when the path ahead is uncertain.

That message is especially meaningful to us at Women's Life Center. Women facing an unexpected or difficult pregnancy may be carrying questions, fears, and circumstances that can feel overwhelming. We want them to know they don't have to navigate those moments alone.

Through compassionate care, practical resources, pregnancy services, education, and ongoing support, we're here to walk alongside women and families as they consider what comes next. Every life has value, and every woman deserves to be met with compassion, dignity, and support.

Where Friendship, Motherhood & Faith Meet

Sometimes God's next step begins with a simple nudge, a conversation with a friend, and a willingness to say, "Yes."

That's how the story of Katie Clegg and Breanna Jones began at Women's Life Center. Best friends, business partners, and moms, they are now stepping into a new season of serving women and families together. After beginning their Women's Life Center curriculum training in September, they are preparing to co-lead "Moms Supporting Moms Through Parenting" this October.

It Started With a Nudge

For Katie, volunteering with Women's Life Center wasn't something she had planned. While out for a run one afternoon, she felt the Holy Spirit prompting her to stop and sign up for an informational session at Generations Church. As she learned more about the Life Center and its mission, she felt God opening a door.

Katie later shared what was on her heart with Breanna and invited her to take the next step alongside her. After conversations with Alisa Newber, Women's Life Center Director, an opportunity emerged for the two friends to co-lead parenting classes. So they said yes.

A Friendship With a Kingdom Purpose

For Katie and Breanna, one of the sweetest parts of this new chapter is getting to serve together. We have been in a sweet season of restoration, and this is continued testimony of God's goodness and faithfulness. He's not done with us yet!" "Their friendship has grown through motherhood, playdates, business, and life.

Now, they are seeing another purpose unfold as they use a place of business God has blessed them with to create space for encouragement, Christ-centered parenting education, and community. As they often ask, "Lord, what's next?", they believe He has brought them back to the roots of their friendship—and given them an opportunity to share that friendship and faith with other women.

We Were Never Meant to Do Life Alone

Katie and Breanna have experienced firsthand the gift of Christ-centered community and the truth that motherhood and life were never meant to be lived alone. Two verses have become especially meaningful to them:

"Two are better than one." — Ecclesiastes 4:9

"Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." — Galatians 6:2

They are excited to offer that same encouragement and community to the women who walk through the doors of Women's Life Center.

"We are encouraged to know that our friendship has had a Kingdom purpose and will now be shared with other women that the Lord specifically calls to the Life Center."

When asked what they would say to someone considering volunteering with Women's Life Center, their answer was simple:

Southeastern NC Human Trafficking Coalition Update



The Southeastern NC Human Trafficking Coalition continues to grow as organizations, community leaders, and advocates work together to prevent human trafficking through education, awareness, and collaboration.

We are excited to announce the formation of the Coalition's Steering Committee, which will provide strategic leadership, strengthen community partnerships, and help guide anti-trafficking initiatives throughout Brunswick County.

The Coalition's first initiative is the Youth Human Trafficking Awareness & Prevention Education Initiative, made possible through an \$8,000 grant from the St. James Service Club. This program will bring a nationally recognized prevention curriculum to youth and youth-serving organizations across Brunswick County, helping equip young people and the trusted adults in their lives with the knowledge to recognize warning signs and stay safe.

Human Trafficking Prevention Begins with Awareness

Today's traffickers often use social media, online gaming platforms, and other everyday interactions to build trust and exploit vulnerable youth. Prevention starts with education.

When young people understand how traffickers manipulate relationships and recognize unhealthy behaviors, they are better prepared to protect themselves and seek help when something doesn't feel right. Parents, caregivers, educators, coaches, youth leaders, and faith communities also play an important role by creating safe environments where young people feel supported, heard, and empowered to speak up.

Schools, churches, youth organizations, and community groups all have the opportunity to strengthen prevention efforts by encouraging conversations about online safety, healthy relationships, personal boundaries, and available local resources.

Every presentation, parent workshop, classroom discussion, and community partnership helps build a stronger network of protection for children and families throughout our region. By investing in prevention today, we are helping create safer communities for future generations.
